School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Lincoln Elementary will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. Lincoln Elementary values the contributions and involvement of families to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement.

This plan also describes the different ways that Lincoln Elementary will support family engagement. The plan explains how families can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

How is it revised?

Lincoln Elementary School invited all families to attend our annual School Forum last spring. These families gave their recommendations on how to review and revise the following: the parent and family engagement policy, the school improvement plan, our school-parent compact, and the family engagement budget.

During the school year, we will implement the following to meet the objectives from the spring recommendations from families on how to revise the school plan in order to improve family engagement. The school will provide the following opportunities for families to communicate their recommendations throughout the school year:

- ❖ A binder is in the main office for families to communicate their recommendation for revisions after viewing the school plan.
- ❖ The school plan is posted on the website for families to view and give recommendations.
- ❖ An annual online survey is posted and distributed requesting feedback of specific areas of importance to enhance our school environment.
- ❖ Specific meetings provide opportunities to communicate family recommendations, such as family academic engagement meetings and activities during the school year.
- ❖ All feedback received during the year is used to revise the plan for the next school year.

Who is it for?

Lincoln Elementary will encourage and provide full opportunity for the participation of all scholars, parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children as describe in this plan.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the plan communicated with all families during our school's Open House. As a reminder, we will provide a copy of the plan to all families in September before the scheduled Parent Teacher Conference event. The plan will also be posted on the school website. Families can also request a copy of the plan in the front office of the school.

What is Title I?

Title I is a program designed to support state and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging state academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs are focused on providing effective means of improving student achievement and including strategies to support family engagement. Lincoln Elementary is a Title I school, part of the "Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA)".

To meet the objective of all Title I schools, Lincoln Elementary must jointly develop with parents and family members a written parent and family engagement policy.

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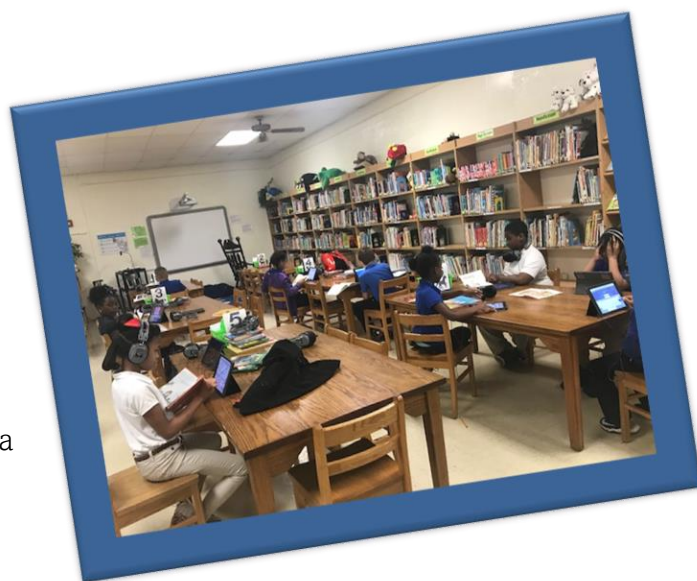

Parent and Family Engagement

Lincoln Elementary will take the following measures to empower and support families as an important foundation of our school in order to strengthen the school and reach our goals.

We will:

- ❖ Ensure that all information related to school and family programs, meetings, and other activities are communicated effectively by posting on the school website, virtual options, sending flyers home, and included in the monthly school newsletter for all families.

- ❖ Provide necessary materials and handouts for parents at conferences, meetings, and activities to help parents work with their scholar(s) to improve their child's academic achievement.
- ❖ Use our Partners in Education and Community Engagement Committee to improve awareness of the activities and events listed in the school parent and family engagement policy.
- ❖ Offer literacy and math workshops for parents and family members to help further enhance their various educational levels.
- ❖ Collect feedback from parents and community stakeholders at all events, place a suggestion box in the parent center and post a suggestion form on the school website to respond to parents' requests for additional support for parent and family engagement activities.
